

# Planning for Impact

Thanks to you, 2019 was a great year for growth and groundwork. Since the Bitterroot was selected as Montana Department of Environmental Quality's first focus watershed - where they will direct extra resources towards reducing non-point source pollution through 2021 - we are doing everything we can to take advantage of this opportunity and leverage additional resources to improve water quality. In July, we added a full-time Restoration Coordinator, Andrea Price, who hit the ground running on restoration project development.

With the COVID-19 pandemic, restoration efforts have continued with socially distanced meetings with landowners and project development for future endeavors.

With you, we are building community around the river. Then, and now. For the future. For everyone. Thank you for being a part of it.





# What is Restoration?

The Water Forum has been doing on the ground restoration work for 10 years. But what does that mean? And how is it done?

For the Water Forum, restoration work improves water quality and wildlife habitat.

The primary concerns for water quality in the Bitterroot are non-point source (NPS) pollution issues of temperature, sediment, and nutrients.

Vegetation along the streambank is very important in combatting these issues and for stream health. This landscape, known as the "riparian area" provides:

- shade to streams to reduce water temperatures
- root systems that stabilize the stream bank
- filtration of pollutants before they can reach the stream
- a food source through leaf litter and debris
- habitat for birds and other wildlife

Our projects focus on the health of the riparian area, often planting native shrubs and trees and protecting this area from cattle and wildlife.

# **Adapting Education**

Education is key in connecting the community with water resources. Through our Earth Stewardship Program, youth in the Bitterroot Valley learn about our watershed and its importance in our lives.



Seventh graders joined us for in-class lessons through the

Fall and Winter, covering topics like irrigation, snowpack, and native fish. The spring field trip went virtual due to the pandemic, and we filmed the work-stations that would have been included.

While people were staying safe at home, we adapted our educational outreach. By connecting with the community through online resources, youth and adults received hands-on activities to get outside and explore the beautiful Bitterroot Valley. Through helpful videos and activities we inspired learning both indoor and out.

Connecting with youth is vital. They are the future and can be the positive influence our water resources need. Your support allows them to have these memorable learning



experiences which will shape their understanding of, and ultimately their impact on, the landscape.


